RESEARCH INTERESTS

Neighborhood determinants of population health and health disparities

- How neighborhoods – the built environment (including parks, tobacco retailers and access to healthcare services) and the social environment (including crime, violence and spatial stigma) – influence population health (especially cardiovascular disease, drug abuse, mental health and HIV)—with special emphasis on minority health and health disparities in New York City and around the

world. Most current work is focused on the health and welling of Black gay, bisexual and other men who have sex with men (MSM), especially as it relates to HIV prevention and HIV treatment.

- Methodologically, this work utilizes a geospatial lens to apply spatially explicit approaches such as computer-based geographic information systems (GIS), web-based geospatial technologies, real-time geospatial technologies and geospatial modeling techniques. For instance, this work applies emerging geospatial technologies such as Global Positioning System (GPS) devices and smartphones to, in part, examine mobility and social networks in neighborhoods.
